

Volunteers Needed for the Pequawket Trail Scenic Byway Corridor Advisory Committee



The Southern Maine Regional Planning Commission is looking for volunteers to serve on the Pequawket Trail Scenic Byway Corridor Advisory Committee. In late 2007, the Maine Department of Transportation designated a portion of the Route 113 Corridor, from Standish to Fryeburg, a State Scenic Byway.

Volunteers are needed from the towns of Standish, Baldwin, Hiram, Brownfield, and Fryeburg to serve on the committee. We plan on meeting every other month for the next year and we hope to have our first meeting in early February. Meetings will be held in the evening at locations along the Scenic Byway Corridor. There will also be two public meetings during the course of the next year to encourage public input.

A Corridor Management Plan is a written document in which the communities along the byway lay out the goals, strategies and responsibilities for protecting and enhancing the byway's most valuable qualities. The Corridor Management Plan can address issues that can be as diverse as economic/tourism development, roadway safety, preservation of natural features, and construction of new facilities. It provides an inventory and assessment of important resources (intrinsic qualities) and outlines specific actions to enhance the qualities that define the corridor.
